CARF Accreditation Accomplished

Club Horizon, Inc. awarded three-year CARF accreditation

CARF International announced that Club Horizon, Inc. has been accredited for a period of three years for its Case Management/Services Coordination: Mental Health (Adults) and Community Integration: Psychosocial Rehabilitation (Adults) programs. This is the first accreditation that the international accrediting body has awarded Club Horizon, Inc.

This accreditation decision represents the highest level of accreditation that can be awarded to an organization and shows the organization's substantial conformance to the CARF standards. An organization receiving a Three-Year Accreditation has put itself through a rigorous peer review process and has demonstrated to a team of surveyors during an on-site visit that its programs and services are of the highest quality, measurable, and accountable.

Club Horizon, Inc. is a nonprofit organization with offices at 101-B Forest Drive Knightdale, NC. It has been providing Case Management/Services Coordination: Mental Health (Adults) and Community Integration: Psychosocial Rehabilitation (Adults) in the Knightdale area since 2004.

CARF is an independent, nonprofit accrediting body whose mission is to promote the quality, value, and optimal outcomes of services through a consultative accreditation process that centers on enhancing the lives of the persons served. Founded in 1966 as the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities, and now known as CARF, the accrediting body establishes consumer-focused standards to help organizations measure and improve the quality of their programs and services.

People Served: Wake County adults, 18 & older with mental illnesses like schizophrenia & bipolar disorder who are stable & ready for community rehabilitation. They are referred to as "members" rather than patients or clients.

Referral Sources: Community Mental Health Professionals, Family members, friends.

What We Do: Rehabilitation program focusing on *meaningful work, meaningful relationship, and the development of daily and community living skills.*

- Members and staff work side by side in work units (kitchen, snack bar, and administrative) from 9:00 a.m. till 4:00 p.m. to carry out the daily functions of the clubhouse.
- Club Horizon assists members in finding entry-level jobs within the community. Training and support are provided by Club Horizon staff throughout the placement.
- Members and staff enjoy social programs in the evenings throughout the year.
- Members are members for life.
- The Community Support Program provides direct services in the community to support rehabilitative, recovery and sobriety goals.

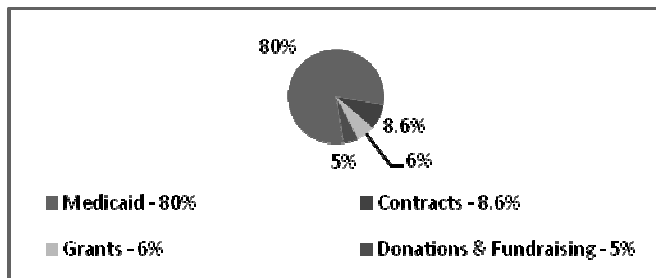

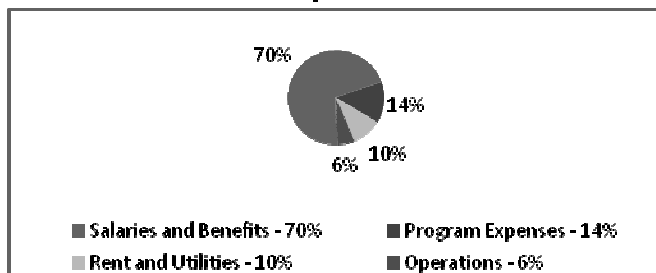
Cost Per Member: \$60 per day compared to \$600 per day in a state psychiatric hospital.
